being lower at the bow and stern than
in midships, such an arrangement of upper
structure appears abnormal, and entirely
opposed to a seaman's idea of a safe
sea-going ship; and the low stokehold
gratings and engine room skylights
do not contribute to her safety.

On the other hand Lloyd's have
recently classed her as an avowing deck
ship, and placed the centre of their mark
about fourteen inches below the main
deck. I fail to conceive how she can
have obtained such a character, as the
so called avowing deck does not extend

throughout the entire length of the
ship.





ship, but terminates several feet from each end; it has evidently been an after thought. The bulkhead on after end, from quarter deck to top of awning deck, is of wood, and stands open the whole time, at nothing else than an unusually long loose extending from side to side with iron sides.

However, having taken into consideration the position assumed by Lloyds, and the action by the Board's staff at Newport, I thought it would not do to detain her, the reason being also in her favour.
