 At this date lifted the lumber boards, and several strakes of the Ceiling planks fore
 and aft both sides and examined the Rivets, Plates, &c. - Scraped and cleaned her outside and
 inside. - Cemented her up to lower turn of bilge. - Gave her a new main mast. Repaired overhauled
 and caulked round Bulwark Stations & Coated the outside, one of Red lead, two of tuck, and the third
 Committee's Minute 23rd May 1865 or last Coat with Tallow &c. - I am of opinion she
 Character assigned 12 A is eligible to remain as Class'd 12. A.1. (and T.S. added)
