Scraped and cleaned the bottom, which upon the whole was free from barnacles, excepting in the run aft, and on the removal of the few found there, behind them (or where they had been sticking.) I found some of the plates had been eaten in round holes to the extent of an eighth of an inch deep. The bottom had now been paid with two coats of red lead Linck, and one of "Peacocks" I am of opinion she is entitled to remain as classed
