REPAIRS Now done:-

Seiling equal to a skate all fore and aft, and the Man-hole covers of the Double Bottom removed. The Frames, Plating, Floor plates, Keelsons, Rivets, Beams, Stringers and Lie-plates where seen, are in good condition.

The cement was sound and adhering satisfactorily to the Iron-plating.

Re-caulked a few leaky Butts in the Bottom, and painted it with two coats of Red-lead-paint, and one of Yellow. Examined the Rudder.
