REPAIRS Now done:-

Bottom sighted, and the timber boards and
 feiling equal to one stroke fore and aft on both sides, removed.
 The frames, Floor plates, Reverse frames, Rivets, Plating, Stringers,
 Beams, Lio. plates, Keel, Stem, Stem post and Rudder, where
 seen, are in good condition. The Cement was found sound
 and good and adhering very satisfactorily to the Iron.
 Scraped and painted inside and outside throughout.

Renewed 30 feet of Main Rail on the starboard side amidships,
 with American Elm; also four Loft timbers with English Oak;
 and the Berthing in wake of the above, with Yellow pine.
