Now done, The timbers and a strake of ceiling on each side lifted in each hold, the cement and all iron work found in excellent condition excepting in the fore peak, where the iron work had been washed with cement, it has now been scraped and painted - The outside scraped and painted with two coats of oxide of iron and one of M'Innes's Patent -
