## REPAIRS, &c.

Ceiling in hold equal to the timber boards and one skate of ceiling on each side lifted. The iron funnel good and the cement now repaired.

The chains ranged on deck and with the rest of the outfit found complete.

An extra hulktrap riveted on hold stringer plate where it had been bent down. Shivers in bulkheads put in order.

Bottom outside cleaned and coated.
