 The timber-boards and ceiling equal to three-strakes fore and aft on each side removed. The frames Plating, Rivets &c in way of same found to be in good condition. The plating coating sound and good and adhering satisfactorily to the iron.  
 Bottom cleaned and coated with Paint and Gallon

The owner's representative was informed that to complete the S.S. &c. the windlass would require to be stripped and the chain-cables ranged on deck but the owner declined doing any thing more for the present and the ship has sailed for the above-named Port
