REPAIRS, &c.

The British Steamer Ulswater grounded in the Baltic on her passage from Newcastle to Kiel, where she sank in the Harbour and after having the cargo of Coals taken out and brought into dock I found on a careful survey that one plate at Port side in the Garboard Strake beside six other plates near this strake were broken, which was also the case of eleven frames and floor plates so that if the vessel had not a double bottom she would have been entirely lost—Repairs. Seven plates have been renewed, broken frames strengthened by double ones and floor plates with double floor plates and double rivetted Bulldozers, as also double reverse angle iron.

Cement on Port side has been taken out and all other parts thoroughly examined
