With reference to your letter of yesterday's date, relative to the staying of the steam domes, on the boilers of the above named vessel, and containing the report No 24973. from Liverpool. And in accordance with the instructions therein, I

inspected the steam domes on the boilers of the above named vessel, and found each dome stayed with three stays 1 1/2 diameters, these stays extending from the roof of the boiler to the top of the dome.

The roof of the boiler inside the dome, is still further stayed by a stay from the top of the Combustion Chamber.

I am of opinion that the steam domes on the boilers of the above named vessel, are now in good order and safe working condition.
