REPAIRS, OR EXAMINATION AS PER RULE

Repairs & Survey No. 1. Survey

12/76

Now done, Pohl side, 5 bench plates in flesh of bottom taken down & replaced with new one plate taken down & refitted, fractured frame strengthened with angle iron at back part 6 ft. in length. Deck partially caulked. Steam winches repaired. Cement replaced where removed. Outside cleaned down & coated with paint. Special Survey No. 1. Survey vessel scraped clean inside & out, timbers cleared & man hole covers lifted on tops of water ballast tanks, all surfaces exposed inside & out, found firm & good. Water ballast tanks tested by a head of water to the height of high water mark.
