Damage through contact with Ice; removed and refitted two plates on the Starboard Bow; on the Port Side, six plates removed and refitted and two plates renewed, one of which was a Stem plate, the whole were in the range of Hold Beams; in way of the above, repaired one frame on the Starboard bow, and five on the Port Bow; Keel and Bottom examined and payed with two Coats of "Rahjans" patent paint
