On the 6th 7. 8th October this vessel encountered a severe gale in the Bay of Biscay which caused the following damage -
 The after pennant & compass carried away -
 One cabin sky light window broken & cabin flooded -
 Fore sail & gear carried away -
 Bridge steering gear disabled and after gear also broken -
 Lolly boat carried away - gun coop, relieving tackle & meat safe -
 Try sail & fore sail split -
 Split main hatch tarpaulins - Engine room sky light cover -
 Sea broke over the fore-castle & strained the deck, bending slightly -
 Two beams - broke galley windows & flooded the galley - This sea started the fore bridge house bulkhead, on the port side, just above the deck - Bridge deck leaky - carried away light
