Dear Sir

We today telegraphed you as follows -
"We wrote Adams on the eighth instant. Screw steamer
"Albion" sails tomorrow morning. Insurance effected subject
her being clarified for nine years. Telegraph determination
your Board. Reply prepaid."

I have since received your reply as under
"Albion" not yet clarified; cannot be clarified until next
Tuesday."

I regret that we should have given you any trouble in
this matter, we were however obliged to do so in order to
secure our insurance; your message is however quite
satisfactory as it informs us that the clarification will
be made on Tuesday next; the fees we have already paid,
you are aware, to Mr Adams. -

The position which we are placed in is the following;
"Albion" leaves Hull tomorrow morning for Brunswick, and
we have insured her with several public companies, and
Lloyds upon the understanding that she will be clarified
within 90 days in your book. Of course had we not received
your message in reply to ours we should have been obliged
to detain the vessel, for if she had gone to sea and anything
had happened between her sailing and next Tuesday


