Sir,

I duly received your letter dated the 20th. instant, returning the Sketch relating to the Iron Ship "Coromillo," in which (since it was last forwarded from this Office) both Keelings shown in red have, it is observed, been marked "Bilge Keelings," No. 1 and 2 respectively; which seems to make it evident that the question raised as to the number of Keelings in this ship has hinged on the Specification put in the term "Bilge Keeling."

The Report has, therefore, been slightly altered accordingly, reference being inserted therein to the Keelings shown in the Sketch alluded to, as thus numbered; which will, it is thought, preclude the possibility of any further misconception on this head, and return henceforth accordingly with the Report and Sketch referred to.
