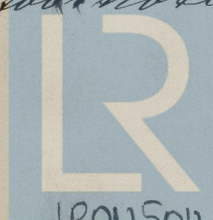

In favor of the 6<sup>th</sup> Inst. I acknowledge  
and add the Report of the new screw Steamer  
Hamburg.

The specification and midship section  
were shortly before my appointment sent by  
Mr. Borchers in Amsterdam to the Committee,  
I annex the letters and copy of specification  
(the original of the latter has remained  
in possession of Mr. Borchers) and according  
to this the anchors and chain cables  
(found too slight) was furnished by the  
builder.

The ship has been built strictly according  
to the Rules of 1870, as the new ones were  
not published till July of this year when  
the ship was half finished.

In the same sense Mr. Furber, the  
builder, points to the footnote of the Table 22.

therefore thinks he is in the right, as the

the Report as the ship is in other respects  
perfect to my mind and executed with  
every care.
