No 23675 - "Alfred" - 84 tons.
 Referred to the General Committee,
 and I am to observe that the Sub
 Committee of Classification here,
 while noting that this Vessel was
 not built under Survey, are never-
 theless disposed to regard the
 case favorably for an additional
 Year's Classification, on account of
 mixed timber materials as used
 in her construction, as recommended
 by the Surveyor, besides the Year
 extra under the "Table A" of the
 Rules now in force. A certificate
 of Class is desired for this Vessel
 also.

No 23678 "Prima" -
 As regards this case, I am to
 observe that the Sub-committee,
 under the circumstances and on
 faith of the Owner's undertaking
 which accompanies this Report,
 to duly test the Riggers and
 Chains referred to on this vessel's
 return from her present intended
 Voyage, have retained the figure 1,-
 and desire to submit the same
 for the General Committee's confirmation
 accordingly.
