In reply received your letter of the
9th Inst in respect to the size of the Beaufort
of the Ship "Strathmore" Register No 4003
I have seen Mr Simpson on the subject.
and he stated that the size decided
on was what he had considered as
sufficient and that he did not desire
the tables of sizes in no other light than
as suggestions and not imperative to
be strictly followed.

I may observe that I was not
aware of the size until they were
been put together & partly completed
with respect to its construction it is
Substantial 4 plates around double
rinded caps & treble riveted battens plates
42 tappins to 11th at water end 2021
outer end and doubled on inside. Strakes
at heel 8 feet deep in 1 plate on every
of stem plate & angle iron foundation

Keapham plate has $3\frac{1}{2} \times 3 \times \frac{1}{2}$ double A¹³
at top & bottom parallel to Bowplate plate,
the length outside the stem plate well not
exceed 20 ft or the hal ships between two
bells, and it was run in further than the
length I had taken. There are two
Cham Bobstays $15\frac{1}{16}'$ & $1\frac{1}{8}'$ short back

I may note that the vessel
has sailed for London from here and
well ere this, arriving so likely arrived
there to lay on for New Zealand where
an opportunity of examining the ship
in all her parts will be thereby
afforded
