The absence of the Manager at Harvey & Co. Hayle, has prevented my getting a reply to the application directed by your letter of the 29<sup>th</sup> Ultimo - respecting the Fees due on the S.S. Lubra - They contend that if the vessel is classed, the Fees should be paid by the present owner, as he only reaps the benefit.

I pointed out the awkward position in which I was placed - the reply was - if you do not get otherwise paid we shall consider ourselves liable to you for your time employed, or expenses out of pocket, but not in the shape of Fees for survey - I should have charged them Surveyors Fees. Ten Guineas Travelling Charges 18/6 - in addition to the Entry Fee -
