of the 11th Inst marked "p" in regard to the new boilers
of the "Moncaliere" being fitted with steam domes
& asking whether means have been taken to stiffen the
shell plates of the boilers under these domes. In answer
thereto, I beg leave to reply that the shell plates of these
boilers have been stiffened under the domes by angle irons
& stays as shown in the inclosed tracing, which I hope
the committee will consider efficient for this and will
grant a certificate for the Engines of this vessel. I take
this opportunity of thanking you for the copy of the report
on explosions of the S.S. "Marcasite" & "Renown" & should
be pleased to receive any other like information for my
guidance in future.
