Dear Sir,

I beg respectfully to acknowledge the receipt of your note of the 3rd inst:- enclosing a Bank cheque for £2.2.0, as payment of the £6.3.0 due to this Society on account of your S. S. "Medusa";- and in forwarding a receipt for the amount in question, to draw your attention to the fact that the charges, which you have struck out of the detailed account furnished you on the 30th ult.- viz. £3.0.0 for registering repairs, and £1.1.0 for the Surveyors services in connection with the repairs, are strictly in accordance with the rules, Sections 24 and 28, copy enclosed, for regulating the charges in such cases; and which I have no doubt, on investigating, you will agree with. - If, as you say "you do not require repairs registering," in the book as I presume is meant, the Committee will, I am sure, on application from you, be prepared to consider that matter. - but for the purposes

of the repair fee due, according to rule,

that effect, submit the matter for the
Committee's consideration.-
