2 1/2 Inch african Oak and new upper Binding  
Strakes of 3 Inch african Oak, Transomes, and  
transome Knees, all Renewed, part of Stern post  
and part of Keelson New. 4 new Hooks, New  
hardlock timbers - New Knees in the upper and  
Lower Deck where required - 6 new Beams,  
New Stanchions, Gunwals, Waterways, and Strakes  
next the Waterways - New Counter, and Counter Timbers  
The bottom Re-strengthened and Every defective  
plank replaced with New. - The upper  
and Lower Deck Bindings, the Transomes  
Hooks, Keel, & Keelson all Rebolled.

Staunch, and Sound in Every respect, and
