Sir

I surveyed the "Forest Monarch"  
on the 23<sup>rd</sup> Nov. 1847 for Classification  
when I considered it necessary to  
recommend 11 Pairs of Iron hanging  
Knees to be fitted to the upper deck  
beams and that she be furnished  
with an additional bower anchor  
and 100 fathoms of 2<sup>nd</sup> Chain Cable.

The Master at that time declined  
fitting the Iron Knees but took onboard  
the additional Anchor & Chain.

I observe by Mr Popes Report of 23<sup>rd</sup>  
June that these Iron Knees are now fitted  
and I concur in Mr Popes Report  
with the single exception that he  
states she is sheathed which I observe  
by my notes that she was doubled  
with 2 Inch Plank on 1<sup>st</sup> July 1847
