The projectors of Mess^{rs} Holderness & Co^s composite ships, were frequently reminded during the long course of trouble, given by them in London, that such ships would be classed according to the quality of the wood used in their construction, if otherwise eligible.

In the Liverpool Letter of the 15th Sept^r/63 referred to by M^r Mudge, wherein the Elm plankings, and 14^A are named, we appear to have omitted to call the Committee's attention to those points.

We are of opinion the Lernindar already classed, should be marked in the Register Book thus.

planking two thicknesses, pt Am. Elm

If the Biennial Survey is strictly adhered to, which it should be, she cannot go so wrong, as regards the condition of the Elm in question.

The two ships pending might be treated in like manner.

We beg respectfully to call Committee's attention to the Elm being at variance with their recent Resolution N^o 16th Aug^r 11/64
