Dear Sir

I have a vessel on the stocks
 abt. 200 tons Register which I wish to have
 classed in your Book providing you can
 give me something acceptable. The frame
 is part second hand & part new, all new
 at the Bilges, second Brick, Hackmatack,
 Spruce in other parts with a few second
 hand English & Stotter in Oak, the Stern and
 Stern post is new English Oak. Keelson
 large and new. Pitch pine and I purpose
 planking her with 4 inch new pitch pine
 outside and inside, flat with second hand
 Brick 4' to 6' of Bilges & above 4' & 3" new
 Pitch Pine. Shelf pieces & good waterways
 I will build her in every respect as regards
 fastenings in strict conformity with
 your Rules. Mr. Daney has seen the frame
 & can give you further particulars if
 required & I shall be glad to know what
 classification your Committee will give
 me. I may add that I intend thoroughly
 to salt her.
