Repairs. *At the present time. New after Falmouth - Hung & hull seam caulked - Fettes and lister with Copper - Bottom caulked - Butts and Woodings Fettes and coppered - Fettes wood sheathed and recoppered.*

General Observations and Opinion, as required by the Instructions.

The Bottom of this Ship is in good condition and has caulked very firm - Upper Course 4 Strakes African Oak - from that to 1st Head Painted Fir 11 Strakes and ships. then 4 inch Foreign Oak to Floor Head - Flat of Bottom 3rd Plank - The Breast Hook Bolts, Deck fastenings - Waterways, Deck - Topsides, Masts - Transoms & Breast Hooks are all in good condition - Stores & Materials all in good condition & well found & is in my opinion entitled to remain classed.
