**Repairs.** At the present time - has been caulked from the keel to the sheathing - the blocks taken out and the keel seam caulked - listing out under the trales and seam caulked together with the butts in the stroke below the trale - New bowsprit Beam & and an additional Breasthook Felted & recoppered.

This ship is now in an efficient state of repair - does not ~~not~~ give any indication of working aloft - Her sails, stores are in good & efficient condition, & she is in my opinion ~~not~~ correctly classed 10A1
