## Repairs.

At the present time has had One new Hold Beam and knees  
3 Pair Iron Hanging knees to Hold Beams and 2 Pair of  
Upper Deck One Plank of the brace shifted on the Starboard side  
11 Planks of the upper course shifted under the bows and Quarter  
2 Planks shifted in the sheer stake and caulked throughout

General Observations  
and Opinion, as  
required by the  
Instructions.

The timbers seen in the different parts where the  
Plank was shifted are in good condition, the  
general appearance in and out board is very  
favourable and in my opinion the vessel  
remains in the present class A. 1
