## Repairs.

At the present time in consequence of damage -  
Several planks shifted in Starboard Quarter - Four planks  
of the Deck - 2 additional Iron Hanging Nuts -  
Several Stanchions shifted - Caulked throughout and  
thoroughly overhauled - Felted and Coppered -  
Masts Spars & Rigging overhauled & put to rights

## General Observations and Opinion, as required by the Instructions.

This vessel is now in an efficient state of  
Repair - The Engines have been examined and  
put to rights. - Her appearance is very favorable  
and she has proved herself to be a strong well  
built vessel - The Timbers seen abaft are  
square & free from sap - The Bottom English and  
African Oak in good condition & well wrought -  
She is in my opinion fully entitled to be classed 11A1
