 Siple Standards together with a Butch abut were put in —
 The Butches exposed amidships and abut are square, sound & of
 good quality — Geo Bayley

She appears to be a very well built vessel
 The timbers of good quality and well
 squared the plank being English Oak of good
 quality and ~~well~~ very well brought and is now
 well fastened. May in my opinion be raised
 to W A 1 in which Mr Bayley (who has inspected her
 also concurs) now agrees to the Rules
