Repairs At the present time Stitches - The sailing between decks & from the lower deck to the Platform Shelf taken out amidships - about 20 additional Trunks put in & the defective Trunks removed - The lower Deck additionally fastened with Iron knees & Ribs several planks of the Forepeak & Oracles shifted on both sides particularly in tray of the fastenings, thoroughly caulked and overhauled - Butts lashed with Guine broodsheeted on Felt & Coppered to the Wale
