Repairs *Has been specially surveyed for continuation & had an Epican Oak Shingle to its every alternate timber & laid bolts through the Deck Beams & Waterways, the fore end is scarfed to the upper Breasthook & runs off six feet abaft the Brake of the Quarter Deck; several of the bolts & trenails have been driven out for examination and found in good condition and the planks through which they pass sound, the Waterways, Beams, Keels, Horse timbers, Knight-heads, Breasthooks, Transoms, Floors, Pelson, Planking, outside & inside, the same where seen, Decks & Comings appear to be all in a sound & efficient state & has kept her original form unaltered.*

General Observations and Opinion, *This vessel having been surveyed in 1834 of English Oak except on long length of Foreign Oak in the Section between the Beams would have been difficult to have been replaid with, therefore we are of opinion from her recent repair & sound & efficient state she should be continued four years in the first class from 1836*
