**Repairs** At the present time has been stripped - 3 Lower Breast Hooks shifted - 2<sup>nd</sup> long Knee Ribs. & 2 Pair long Iron Bars put to Hold Beams, opened at the plank above the Bidge fore and aft - Caulked throughout, sheathed with yellow metal upon Patent Hemp Sheathing or felt.

We have duly examined her in accordance with Sec 54 - And find the Bolts of the upper and lower Decks, the planks through which they pass, Waterways, Beams, Hawse Timbers, Knight Heads, Apron, Breast Hooks, Transoms, Floors, Keelson, Timbers in the Bidge, Planking outside, Ceiling & the inner surface of the planking, Decks & Comings are all sound and in good condition - The keel is straight & she appears to have retained her original strength - Several trenails were driven out in various parts of found good & sound
