**Repairs** At the present time. A state of trade in trade of lower  
 Deck fastenings shifted. Lower Deck fastenings renewed  
 Doubled from the keel up to sheer strakes with Pitch Pine  
 & Oak in trade of fastenings & chain Bolts. New African  
 Oak Plank sheen - Red Pine butternuts - nearly all new  
 Stanchions. Yellow Metal repaired, good - New Chain  
 Bolts - The Doubling is brought over a coating of fine  
 Y oil -
