**Repairs** At the present time has been opened on each side at the Bidge in accordance with the Rule 63 - and all the Timbers found to be in good condition excepting one side & 3 of the other 2 on each side abaft, the Iron Hanging knee put to every Hold Beam Crotch by Ridding Transom - pair of Iron Rides & Iron Hanging knee to every Deck Beam now in proper - Hung, Caulked from the keel up - and generally caulked -
