**Repairs** At the present time stripped. The blackstakes (2 stakes)  
 shifted each side, Toppide dubbed down white and defective  
 parts removed - Wals cleaned down - Riggers unbolted and  
 refitted - Top Gallant Tricastle fitted - New Chain Bolls  
 Caulked keel up over all - Masts stripped & overhauling

The Timbers of the Frame were perfectly sound and good along  
 their whole, except in way of the Blackstakes. The bolts and Treennails  
 driven out were good, the plank and timber through which they passed  
 sound and good. The Waterways, Beams, Sawles, Timbers, Knight Heads, Breast Hooks,  
 Transoms, Floors, Keelsons, Planking outside, Keel to Gunwale, Ceiling inside  
 frame and inner surface of the outside planking, Decks and Comings are also  
 sound and good and the keel straight & her Shear unaltered -
