Repairs She has within a few years (said to be 1838) had new outside Planking from the 3rd Strake below the Topper up New Wales, Topsides, Decks & new ceiling ~~and~~ in wales of the Engine Room - The expense of this repair is stated to have been £4000 -
 At the present time Caulked throughout, generally re-caulked & sheathed with yellow staital upon ~~10~~ 10 feet 3 inches -
