General Observations and Opinion, *W* enabled from the shell overall, and the upper cranium of the bottom throat and mouth. The outside of the body presents a very firm appearance. The Clavos, Mergers, and lower part of the Scales are in a condition that the shell has been broken down. The sides of the tin have the same appearance. In the lower part of the tin there is a strong, good second stage of life.
