## REPAIRS

At the present time doubled the deck with  $1\frac{1}{2}$  inch seasoned Transverse for, Shipla 2 whole & 1 half Hold Beams. & 2 heavy Beams. Retained the sides & clamps between decks, which are in a very unsatisfactory state and cannot be made better without taking down the heavy Beams to the Deck Beams & unbolting the Hold Beam Standards.

Left and carry the owners attention to the Hold Beams, such clamps & clutty
