## REPAIRS

At the present time stripped, hung the ship and  
 caulked from keel to waterways; Shifted 4 Hold  
 beams & 4 knees (broken) Rebolten the hold beam clamps  
 & lower breasthook fitted one new breasthook in hold  
 drove out and Renewed the treenails in midships; New  
 Capstan & steering wheel; Repaired the Windlass, & pumps  
 fitted a pair of Iron cheeks to Head knee. New Bowspile  
 main yard & fore top mast: Re Coppered on paper;
