REPAIRS

At the present time Shifted 17 Strakes of
 deck on the Starboard & 14 on the Starboard
 side, leaving in the foremost and aftermost shifts,
 & fitted a 6 inch African Oak Clamp on the Bowspit beam.
 On Removing the old deck, all the Beams were
 found to be in a perfectly sound & good state -
