REPAIRS

At the present time - One unshewn Deck Beam
 a shelf bolt fitted to lower Deck, several bolts shifted
 caulked from the wood sheathing up and generally
 overhauled aloft - I recommended to water
 in 1840 - June - stated to have been wood sheathed on felt
 at Calcutta which appears to have been the case from
 the appearance of the sheathing
