REPAIRS at the present time stripped 5 middle deck & lower Deck & upper Deck keels shifted - Butts & Wood ends caulked - Caulked from wood sheathing up on all and all three of the Decks caulked - 4 Planks shifted each side in way of chain Channels - Timbers good where opened, Channels refitted - new chain Channel Bolts, all the Bolt Bolts shifted in Deck standards - sheathed with Yellow Metal & generally overhauled - started fastenings of keels shifted
