REPAIRS at the present time.

Fitted 3 pair of hanging knees to the hold beams  
 Shifted 2 planks in the deck next the waterway on the Starboard side on the  
 Starboard side. The beams and knees very good where seen. New Spirketting  
 Plankshen 2 then Strake on the Starboard bow & 3 new timbers: drove out  
 several treenails bolts in hold beam & deck knees. The treenails all  
 very good, some of the bolts in the deck beam have a little corroded. Renewed  
 all the throat bolts in midships.

Examined the outside planking from the copper up. Waterways  
 Beams, Hawse timbers, Wright heads, Breasthooks, Transoms, Floors, Ribson,  
 all which are in good sound condition where they can be seen  
 The inner surface of the outside planking is good & close to the timbers  
 Cieling very good. Decks & Linnings in good condition, Kiel  
 straight & then unaltered -
