REPAIRS At the present time, shifted part of Stowage on both sides then took of Stowage on the Starboard bow and several September Stowage stacks of deck and the waterways, both sides. Beams and timbers very good. Careless from the Copper over all: fitted a new key in the blocks;

Examined the upper & lower deck between the stowage through which they pass: the waterways, beams, stowage timber, Height-heads, Breasthooks and Transoms. The Stone Millstone. Standing outside from the Copper up the Ceiling inside, the beam and inner surface of the outside planking where it can be seen, stabs & cunnings, which are in good condition.

The Keel is straight & has been good.
