REPAIRS At the present time shipped - The two upper staves of doubling removed - main bottom caulked - Doubling replaced with new - The whole of the Doubling refastened - 3 additional Transoms across the stem and counter timbers and knee brace and - several Deck Beams shifted - 4 Pair Staple stands cut Green Deck - 2 pair Iron Hanging knees - 4 Deck stands cut & 6 pair Iron Hanging knees to middle Deck - New Head Rails introduced refastened - New Roughten Rails, several staybolts - Rudder sinking examined & refastened Caulked throughout and sheathed with Yellow Putal upon Patent Lath
