REPAIRS For Restriction - At the present time New Spikes of English Oak Planks Topside of Deck under Deck - Sheer Stakes all new excepting three Planks on each side shifted in 1838-9 - and one plank forward on each side of still older date - All new upper and lower Deck fastenings, and the Beam Ends are good and sound as also are the top timbers - Keel Wales & Header Timbers upon and stem at the Head so far as they can be seen.

Repairs requisite to render her eligible to be recommended for Restriction  
New Fire and after Drifts  
Copper to be stripped  
Stake to be removed each side on the upper course of Bottom  
Plank each side inside at the Beize  
That portion of the Sheer Stakes forward, shifted prior to 1838.
