Topside of each India Stak— Sheer Stakes all new excepting three
Planks on each side shifted in 1888-9— and one plank forward on each
side of still older date— All new upper and lower Deck fastenings, and the
Baum Ends are good and sound as also are the top timbers— Knight Beams
& Howe Timbers— Apron and Stern at the Head so far as they could secure.

Stake to be removed each side on the upper course of Bottom
