Shipped, hung, caulked from the keel to the main
next the waterways, fitted new plankwork & then strake
on the Starboard quarter & shifted 5 shal plank shal of
Counter timber; shifted 2 shal planks on the Larboard quarter
New Quarter pieces on both sides - Repaired bulwarks
Rails & chain plates, new Main Shiver Mast, with better
Rigging, sails &c (which had been carried away)
Sheathed with yellow metal on keel
