REPAIRS At the present time shipped the Boat to
 caulk the upper course of bottom. I worked
 8 Mths. of but boat to in felt;
 laid new decks 3" clank in deal; & sheathed
 two main hatchway beams: the remainder of
 the beam very good sound

The Beams of this Ship were all fresh felled timber put on board
 and covered up at once without seasoning in the slightest
